NEWS FROM ASSESSOR Kim Anderson



2015 is our quadrennial assessment year. My staff and I conducted sales studies and looked at the reassessment possibility for over 20,000 properties. I am happy to say that this task was completed on time and my staff did a tremendous job. This was no easy task.

For the first time since 2009 Will County realized an increase in values. The County-wide increase was 2.77%. Our Troy Township realized a 4.0% increase in overall value. This is a true sign of a better economy. This increase in value does not mean that all properties in Troy Township were raised 4%. The only increase in value to properties came from the results of our studies.

Our Township continues to grow. We had 92 newly constructed homes in 2012, 125 in 2013,

160 in 2014, and 2015 is looking even better. The Township has also seen commercial and industrial growth. There are many exciting projects coming to our Township that are currently in the works with Joliet and Shorewood. Commercial and industrial growth adds to our tax base thus keeping our property taxes lower than they would be without them.

We continue to work on our website as time permits. As we measure new construction, a drawing and photo is added to the property characteristics. As always, I encourage you to review your property information and contact us immediately should you find an error.

Exemptions, Senior Freeze & Common Questions

The Assessor's office has all of the necessary forms to apply for exemptions. We are always happy to assist you in filling them out and getting them to the County. Exemptions that are available are: General Homestead, General Senior Homestead, Senior Freeze, Disabled Person, Disabled Veteran,

Returning Veteran and Home Improvement. Please note there are qualifications for each exemption. To see if you qualify, please visit the Assessor section of our website under the exemption tab. If you do not have access to a computer, please call us anytime between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. daily.

Frequently Asked Questions

A commonly asked question is: "Do I have to renew my homestead exemptions?" The answer is "no" unless you move to a new home.

Another common question is: "When can I apply for the Senior Freeze and what does it do?" You must be 65 years old or older, the home you live in must be your primary residence, your total

household income must be less than \$55,000 and you must have lived in the home for two January's. The Senior Freeze freezes the assessed value of your home **NOT your taxes**. This exemption is especially valuable when market values rise. Your property's value will always be frozen at the lowest amount as long as you renew your application every year.

We encourage you to sign up for Nixle alerts; messages from public agencies that come directly to your email or via text message to your cell phone. You can register for messages based on where you live, work or any other location or agency that you wish to stay informed about. Agencies that participate in Nixle alerts include

Shorewood Police Department, Joliet Police Department, Channahon Police Department, Crest Hill Police Department plus many more. You can select the agencies that you wish to receive communication from and how you wish to receive those messages. HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER Thomas R. Ward

This past spring and early summer was one of the wettest on record. In fact, the National Weather Service estimates that since about March 1, 2015, our area has had upwards of 20 inches, if not close to 30 inches of rain. This heavy amount of rain creates standing water and drainage problems. We are doing our best to keep positive drainage throughout all of the unincorporated areas of the township. You can do your part by making sure that your culverts are free and clear of all debris.

This summer we did numerous seal coating and blacktop projects throughout the unincorporated areas of the township. Road projects are determined by need after each winter. Roads that need some minor repairs may not get resurfaced but are sealed to stop deterioration until funds allow for resurfacing.

At our yard, please be aware that we do not accept grass, weeds or any other yard waste. It is very costly to dispose of these items. We can accept branches but the Highway Department will not accept items such as tree stumps, shrubs, bushes, leaves, grass, etc. Residents with grass, shrubs, bushes, etc. should dispose of them per their garbage collection service company's requirements/specifications.

Lastly, I would like to talk a little about recycling at the Troy Township Highway Department.

Our facility is merely one of many sites for Will County. With that said, we can only take recycling for the containers we are allocated. The vendor that picks up our traditional recycling (paper, plastic, and glass) has informed us that pure garbage, along

with other foreign objects, is being thrown in these recycling containers. If this continues, the vendor will pull their recycling containers from our site and recycling will be discontinued here at Troy.

For electronic recycling,



please do not leave equipment outside of our gates. This creates a hazard for those people who are using the bike path and causes extensive additional labor hours. Please remember that first and foremost we are a Highway Department here to take care of the roadways in the unincorporated areas of Troy Township. We do not have extra funding to provide the recycling services and therefore need the assistance of you, the residents, to follow procedures. Doing so will ensure the recycling program runs smoothly and does not become so cumbersome that it needs to be eliminated.

Please note that with our recycling program, we DO NOT accept paint, other household liquids, light bulbs, or batteries. We encourage you to visit www.willcountygreen.com for more information on where to recycle these plus many other items.

New Rail Road Crossing Gates Shepley Road

Thanks to grant funding provided by the Local Rail/Highway Grade Crossing program, the railroad crossing on Shepley Road in the unincorporated area of Troy Township will soon have LED flashing light signals and crossing gates. This is one of the most dangerous crossings in the Township due to the tracks being located

at the top of blind hill and curve in the road. We are excited to have this new safety feature added, at no cost to the tax payers, which will help to ensure the safety of those traveling across this crossing.

Work is expected to be completed in the fall of 2015.

Open Burning Restrictions

Everyone loves a fall bonfire and along with fall comes leaf raking and sometimes leaf burning. Residents in the unincorporated areas of Troy Township must follow Will County's Nuisance Ordinance which restricts open burning. Both the Will County Sheriff's Office and the Will County Land Use Department have the authority to enforce the ordinance.

Residents who are in an incorporated area should check with their specific municipality for their open burning ordinances.

SERVICES FOR UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF TROY TOWNSHIP

LEAF VACUMMING

Starting the middle of October through November, Troy Township Highway Department will have the leaf vacuuming service for residents in the "unincorporated" areas of the township. Residents must rake leaves to the edge of the street so the vacuum machine can

reach them easily. Do not place leaves in ditches as the vacuum cannot reach leaves in ditch areas. Grass cuttings will not be picked up as we have no way of disposing them. Please be advised that the leaf vacuuming service may be put on hold with the occurrence of a snow or ice event.

BRANCH & BRUSH PICK UPS

The final branch and brush pick ups for this fall will be on Monday, October 5th, Monday, October 19th and Monday, November 2nd. This service will resume again at the beginning of April 2016 on the first and third Mondays of each month.

WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER

Winter weather is just around the corner. Township trucks and road crews will be out plowing and salting the "unincorporated" road areas. We ask that the residents keep their vehicles off the streets when there has been a

snowfall so the plows can safely and efficiently plow the streets and cul-de-sacs. Please use extra caution when driving near these vehicles as our trucks, plows and road crews are on the streets working for your safety.

Shredding Event and Medication Disposal October 3rd

Join us on Saturday, October 3, 2015, from 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. when Troy Township will host its increasingly popular semi-annual shredding event. Troy Township residents can bring their personal papers and documents to the township parking lot on the west side of the township offices and community center to be shredded by ShredX. Each resident must show proof of township residency and is allowed to have two letter size file or copy paper boxes shredded.

Troy Township is proud to once again partner with the Shorewood Police Department and will be offering medication disposal along with the shredding event. Township residents can bring their unneeded

medication so that it can be disposed of properly. A list of acceptable items can be found on our website at www.troytownship.com under the News, Notes & Events section.

Make sure to bring only residentially generated medication items. No medications from businesses or doctor's offices will be accepted. Use a permanent marker to black out your name or personal information on the label.

participate, please call 815-744-1963 to pre-register.


