NEWS FROM ASSESSOR Kim Anderson



The 2016 reassessment notices were mailed out July 29, 2016 and published in the Joliet Herald News on August 3rd. If you did not receive a notice in the mail, it is because your property was not reassessed. You can check your 2016 assessment online at the

Will County Supervisor of Assessments website at www.willcountysoa.com or give my office a call.

The three year sales study conducted for Troy Township did indicate that an increase in assessments was necessary. Market conditions in our Township are consistently showing improvement. In 2015 a 4% total Township increase was needed and in 2016 a 6% total Township increase was needed. New home construction continues to increase as does commercial and industrial. We are seeing an increase in custom built homes which is very encouraging. Troy's current parcel count as of August 2016 is 20,284 which is an increase of 168 parcels over 2015. As always, I appreciate my staff that does an exceptional job on maintaining all these properties. My office receives many compliments from you, the taxpayer, for their kindness, expertise and service that is provided.

Please note that if your assessment did increase it does not necessarily mean that your property tax bill will. The dollar amount due on your property tax bill is based upon the demand of tax dollars needed to operate all the taxing bodies in your neighborhood.

I always encourage you to review your property record card. We maintain hard copies here in the office and you can also check your information on our website at www. troytownship.com. We continue to update and make changes to our property maintenance within our website. If you notice that something is not correct, please contact us immediately. (Please note that our website is a work in progress and your assessment may not be based upon the information contained on that page.)


If you suffer a property loss due to a fire, please notify my office. A reduction in your value may be warranted and we do not always receive fire reports.

There are many exemptions available to homeowners. Please visit our website to view all the exemptions that are available and a short list of what the requirements are for each one. If you need more specific information, please contact our office at any time.

The most misunderstood exemption available is the "Home Improvement Exemption". If you make a physical change to your property that adds value, e.g. in-ground pool, deck, patio, addition, etc. the value that is added to your property will be exempt from property taxes for 4 years. This exemption has an effective date of January 1, so if you added a deck in 2015 you will not realize the exemption until 2016. This exemption has a cap of \$25,000 in assessed value or \$75,000 in market value.

One of the most common questions received in my office is why are property taxes different within my neighborhood? Property taxes can be different for many reasons. The most common reason is the exemptions that someone receives on their property that you do not. Another reason has to do with the assessment placed on the property. Assessments are done based upon size, style and different amenities that each property has. If you would like to compare your taxes to others in your neighborhood, please contact us with either the parcel number or address and we will be happy to assist you.

My office is always happy to answer any questions or concerns you have regarding the value placed upon property and we are happy assist you in any other way that we can. Our office hours are Monday – Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

November 8, 2016 is shaping up to be the most exciting presidential election we have ever seen in our lifetimes. Again, as in past articles I have written for The Troy



As the construction season comes to a close it is not be as effective in time to get ready for fall and winter.

Very soon we will be preparing the trucks to start our leaf vac operations for the unincorporated areas of Troy Township. We ask that residents of the unincorporated area do not put leaves in bags. It is easier for the equipment if the leaves are raked to the edge of the roadway. Please take a moment to review the instructions below or on our website at www.troytownship.com/hwy--commissioner/leafvacuuming.aspx.

With winter right around the corner we are beginning to prepare our equipment for the winter season. I'd like to remind all residents to please slow down when you see snow removal and ice control equipment on the roadways. Please remember that due to blowing and drifting snow and/or extremely low temperatures, snow and deicing products will

open areas of the roadway and with the lower temperatures. Please keep this in mind and travel with extreme caution this winter season.



The entire Troy Township Highway Department takes great pride in the work we do. I ask that you please do your part to help keep the ditches and drains in front of your homes clear of debris. SERVICES FOR UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF TROY TOWNSHIP

LEAF VACUMMING

Starting the middle of October through November, Troy Township Highway Department will have the leaf vacuuming service for residents in the "unincorporated" areas of the township. Please do not bag the leaves. Residents must rake leaves to the edge of the street so the vacuum machine can reach them easily. Do not place leaves in ditches as the vacuum cannot reach leaves in ditch areas. Grass cuttings will not be picked up as we have no way of disposing them. Please be advised that the leaf vacuuming service may be put on hold with the occurrence of a snow or ice event.

WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER

snowfall so the plows can safely and efficiently plow the streets and cul-de-sacs. Please use extra caution when driving near these vehicles as our trucks, plows and road crews are on the streets working for your safety.

Shredding Event and Medication Disposal October 1st

Join us on Saturday, October 1, 2016, from 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. when Troy Township will host its next semi-annual shredding event. Troy Township residents can bring their personal papers and documents to the township parking lot on the west side of the township offices and community center to be shredded by ShredX. Each resident must show proof of township residency and is allowed to have two letter size file or copy paper boxes shredded.

Troy Township is proud to once again partner with the Shorewood Police Department and will be offering medication disposal along with the shredding event. Township residents can bring their unneeded medication so that it can be disposed of properly.

Make sure to bring only residentially generated medication items. No medications from businesses or doctor's offices will be accepted. Use a permanent marker to black out your name or personal information on the label.

NEEDLES APPROPRIATELY CONTAINED WITHIN AN APPROVED SHARPS CONTAINER WILL NOW BE ACCEPTED AT THE EVENT!

Chicago Crime Scene Cleanup has agreed to partner with us and will be onsite to collect and properly dispose of the needles. IMPORTANT....only needles that are properly contained within an approved sharps container will be accepted. You can purchase approved sharps containers at most drug stores or pharmacies.
