Being the *Government Closest to the People*, I believe it is important that your township elected officials and the township staff be easily accessible to the residents which we serve. That is why the township participates at local community events such as the Shorewood Area Chamber of Commerce's Community Business Expo, the Crossroads Festival Parade and will be an exhibitor at the October Senior Expo sponsored by Will County.

In 2011, the township has continued to be visible and address the needs of our residents. Since you received the Spring 2011 newsletter, the township has continued to thrive; providing necessary programs and services and participating in events, such as:

weed complaints for the unincorporated areas of the township, provide voter registration services, early voting services, notary public services, computer cyber niche training and more.





## General Primary Election March 20, 2012


The next election will be the General Primary Election to be held on March 20, 2012. For this election, the Township will once again be a designated early voting and absentee voting site for residents of Troy Township. Both early and absentee voting will take place at the Troy Township Community Center located at 25448 Seil Road in Shorewood.

**EARLY VOTING** will be open starting Monday, February 27, 2012 through Thursday, March 15, 2012. Early voting hours are from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

**ABSENTEE VOTING** will be offered on Friday, March 16, 2012 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

To be eligible to early vote or absentee vote at the township, you must:

- 1. Reside in Troy Township.
- 2. Be a registered voter.
- 3. Present a valid government issued ID.





### NOT A REGISTERED VOTER?

You can register to vote at the township office. Hours for voter registration are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The last day to register to vote before the March 20, 2012 election is February 21, 2012.

# ASSESSOR NEWS Patricia A. Gabrielson, CIAO/I

The 2011 quadrennial year reassessment has been completed and notices have been sent to all taxpayers from the Will County Supervisor of Assessments office. Assessments were

published on August 17th in the Herald News and assessments can also be seen on the Supervisor of Assessments website at www.willcountysoa.com. Hopefully everyone paid close attention to this notice. It is too late to file an appeal with the Board of Review but if you have any questions regarding your new assessment, please call our office and we will explain how we arrived at the assessment.

Most residential homeowners saw a decrease in their assessment, perhaps not the decrease that was expected, but as I have explained in previous newsletters, assessments lag behind true market value. This was also true during the years when sale prices were increasing at a significant rate. The three year sales study used by the Department of Revenue is beneficial to the homeowner when the market is increasing in value, but when that same principle is applied in a declining market the average homeowner finds this principle hard to understand. Remember, a decrease in your assessment does not necessarily mean a lower tax bill. Tax rates are based on budgets of the local taxing districts, so even if your assessment has gone down your tax bill may not.

Senior Citizens Assessment Freeze: There is still time to file for the 2011 exemption. You must be 65 years old with a total household income below \$55,000. This exemption freezes your assessment in the year you qualify and must be renewed each year. We also have the Senior Homestead Exemption that can be applied for in the year a person reaches the age of 65. This exemption is a \$4,000 reduction to the assessment on your permanent residence. There is no renewal required for this exemption and it is not based on income. Our staff will be happy to assist you in filing for these exemptions.

## Community Garden Comes to Troy Township

This summer Troy Township partnered with the Village of Shorewood to bring Shorewood residents and residents of unincorporated Troy Township a community garden. The garden, located just north of the Troy Township Community Center was a flourish of activity this summer. With over 90% of the plots sold for the current gardening season, the Community Garden is considered a huge success! 

### **Dial-A-Ride Bus Service**

Troy Township contracts with PACE Dial-A-Ride Bus Service for residents within Troy Township. Rider eligibility under the program is for persons ages 60 and older and persons with disabilities. This service provides door-to-door transportation within the designated ridership area. The cost for use of the Dial-A-Ride service is \$2.00 for each trip. Reservations should be made 24 hours in advance by calling 800-244-4410. Reservation and service

hours are 6:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Requests for service the day of the trip will be honored on a first come/first serve basis, to the extent that the request can be accommodated according to availability of that day's schedule. The passenger will be notified of the approximate pick-up time. This service does not operate on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.



## Will County Offers FREE Household Electronic Recycling Pick Up

Will County now offers a new, convenient electronic recycling pick up service for Troy Township residents. This program is a free service offered to all residents with first floor entrances. The Electronic Products Recycling and Reuse Act, passed by the Illinois General Assembly in 2008, states some electronic materials will no longer be accepted at landfills beginning January 2012. Will County has been actively preparing for this new legislation, establishing electronic recycling sites at numerous key locations across the region.

This program will be the first free household pickup service offered in Illinois. Residents will be able to schedule a pickup of unwanted electronics by contacting Vintage Tech Recyclers.

Items accepted include: computers, laptops, monitors, printers, televisions, all types of telephones, answering machines, computer mouse devices, keyboards, zip drives, computer cables, string lights, microwaves, fax, scanners, MP3s, PDAs, video game consoles, video cassette players/recorders, DVD players and more. There is a limit of 10 items per service call, but future service dates can be arranged as necessary.

Drop-off services will remain available for apartment residents or anyone without front-door access. For more information or to schedule a pickup contact Vintage Tech Recyclers at 877-786-4715.

# **Shredding Event –Saturday, October 15th Helps Township Residents Protect Identity and Save Money**




On Saturday, October 15, 2011 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., Troy Township residents can take their personal papers and documents to the township parking lot on the

west side of the township offices and community center to be shredded by ShredX. Since identity fraud is a possibility for anyone, this service will help residents destroy personal papers in a safe and timely manner, not to mention save money. Some local retailers charge around \$0.59 per pound of papers you wish to recycle. Each resident must show proof of township residency and is allowed to have two letter size file or copy paper boxes shredded. The Township Community Center is located at 25448 Seil Road, Shorewood.

## **Troy Township Highway Department Hard at Work**

This past summer, the Troy Township Highway Department was hard at work on many projects throughout the township. Keeping township roads safe is a top priority for the Highway Department. As you travel around the township you will notice three road improvement projects completed this summer. They

are: Mound Road from River Road to just east of Mattox Lane; County Line Road from Seil Road north to Route 52 and Frontage

Road from Mound Road south to Camelot Road.

## Services for Unincorporated Areas of Troy Township

## **Leaf Vacuuming**

Starting the middle of October through November, Troy Township Highway Department will have the leaf vacuuming service for residents in the "unincorporated" areas of the township. Residents must rake leaves to the edge of the street so the vacuum machine can reach them easily. Do not place leaves in ditches as the vacuum cannot reach leaves in ditch areas. Grass cuttings will not be picked up as we have no way of disposing them.

### **Winter Snow Removal Reminder**

Winter weather is just around the corner. Township trucks and road crews will be out plowing and salting the "unincorporated" road areas. We ask that the residents keep their vehicles off the streets when there has been a snowfall so the plows can safely and efficiently plow the streets and cul-de-sacs. Please use extra caution when driving near these vehicles as our trucks, plows and road crews are on the streets working for your safety.

## **Branch & Brush Pick Ups**

Branch and brush pick ups will be on the first Monday in October and the LAST branch & brush pickup will be on Monday, November 7, 2011. This service will resume again in May.

## Textile Recycling Now Available to Troy Township Residents

In an effort to keep clothing, bedding, towels and the like out of landfills, Troy Township has partnered with USAgain to offer textile recycling. Two clearly marked green and white textile recycling bins are now located at the Troy Township Highway Department, 25358 Seil Road, Shorewood, to serve as collection stations. Collection is available Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Troy Township

is working to keep the 100 million pounds of pre-owned, unwanted textiles out landfills every week. Aside from clothing and bedding, shoes, draperies, hats, belts, purses and other clothing items are being collected for recycling. All items should be bagged before being placed inside the green and white USAgain bins. For more information contact USAgain at (800) 604-9533.




